SUBJECT: Release of Procurement Data Standard Version 2.4

The Procurement Data Standard (PDS) provides the required data structure for distributing contract actions in accordance with Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation (DFARS) 204.201. Phase I, published July 21, 2008 (reference(b)), covered new contracts and orders. Phase II, published July 28, 2009 (reference (c)), established a method for communicating data on contract modifications and addressed issues discovered during Phase I implementation.

This memorandum is to notify you that PDS Version 2.4 is now available at the Program Development and Implementation (PDI) webpage:

PDS Version 2.4 enables Components to send Construction and Architecture and Engineering (A&E) contracts, along with other enhancements. The other enhancements include, but are not limited to, the following:


- Removal of Lump Sum and Dollars as Units of Measurement in accordance with reference (d);
- Addition of Delivery Lead Time Events;
- Addition of Women-Owned Business Types in accordance with Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) Case 2010-015;
- Deletion of the separate payment instruction section as a result of DFARS Case PGI 2009-P003; and

- Expansion of acceptable Data Format Types for attachments.

For a complete listing of all enhancements, the PDS Version 2.4 Change Log is available at the link provided above.

Each Component's Contract Writing Capability should plan to implement PDS Version 2.4 by December 31, 2013. Submit implementation schedules to the DPAP/PDI group inbox (DPAP_PDI@osd.mil) by February 28, 2013. Implementation schedules should include the current release schedule for each applicable Contract Writing Capability and any planned Engineering Change Proposals (ECPs).
